A. INTRODUCTION

The City Health Office continues to operate its vital role in delivering the basic health services to our people, especially in the preventive aspect.

The significant 2005 operation is the increase of number of TB cases treated. The increase is due to intensified campaign against this dreaded disease with extensive health education and case finding activities in the barangays, supported by non-government organization which include: Cullion Foundation Inc., World Vision and Phil. Coalition Against Tuberculosis (PhilCAT). We also recognized the major role played by the private physicians in the control of tuberculosis which is up to now one of the killers of the Filipino people.

Another significant result is the outreach program of the City Mayor, "DAN LIM CARES" wherein the City Health Office provide assistance in terms of medical manpower and some medicines. This activity brought the government closer to the people.

Tagbilaran City being the gateway of Bohol, the tourist destination of the country today goes with it the influx of Guest Relation Officers which served as the Hospitality Girls to our local and foreign tourist. Again, the City Health Office being the mandated agency to monitor the activities, they are regularly examined to safeguard the general public from sexually transmitted diseases.

It is high time to be an accredited Sentrong Sigla from the Department of Health in Terms of Personnel and health facilities. This will be on the 3rd or 4th quarter of this year.

In our desire to bring the government closer to the people, we will implement the approved ordinance for the creation of the Satellite Clinics. Each clinic will cater three to four barangays and this will be manned by Doctor, Nurse, Midwife and Barangay Health Workers.
